

ALTERNATIVE FINISH FOR 4 SELVEDGES



An alternative finish to the four selvedge which makes a more even but more visible edge requires that you weave a few passes of a thicker warp before you begin the weaving and when you end the weaving



Once the weaving is removed from the loom these additional passes are removed (recommended to remove one by one initially) and each loop of warp is passed through the neighbor loop to form a chain. The final loop can be secured by passing one of the remaining free edge warps of the 4 selvedge warping through this loop and back into the weaving and the last bit of weft on the finish of the weaving through the top last loop and back into the weaving (note advantage to ending the weft at the top on the edge where the last loop will be).



These chaining loops allow for more ease of adjustment if you should end with an uneven balance of warp ends. There is also an advantage to using colored warps as the loops can blend more easily into the weaving.
